i. Determinants of Dietary Intake among Rural Farming Households in North-Western Nigeria.

Records of poor dietary intake in Northern Nigeria has attracted attention at the national and international level. The study is investigating determinants of dietary intake among rural farming households in Northwestern, Nigeria.

Research instrument has been validated and pretested. Field enumerators have been trained, data collection and coding concluded. Data entry and analysis are in progress.

- Utilization of information and communication technologies for nutrition education among community health workers in Imo state, Nigeria.
 The incidence of malnutrition in Nigeria due to lack of access to nutritious food, lack of appropriate nutrition knowledge necessitated the study. Reconnaissance survey has been done and the study areas mapped out. Cross sectional survey has commenced. The result will help improve dietary intake in the state.
- iii. Determinants of the Utilization of Insecticide Treated Nets (ITN) Among Households in Oyo State-Nigeria.
 Despite several efforts put in place to control the malaria pandemic in Nigeria, the incidences of malaria is still very high. The study therefore is designed to ascertain utilization of Insecticide Treated Nets (ITN) among households in Oyo State-Nigeria. Design of research instrument and pretest are concluded.
