I have published works in these areas. All these with special reference to natural resources management and agriculture
- c) Institutional and programme management Professional experiences worldwide (universities, FAO, ICRAF, IBRD, DFID, NRI, ADB, AFORNET, NCF, RSPB, Several NGOs and PSOs, National and State Governments) contribute significantly to understanding the management of institutions, including human and material /natural resources. Have initiated and been involved in many programmes and activities in many institutions. I have come to appreciate the value of diversity of cultures, gender, religions, opinions etc. and developed a very positive attitude towards them.
- d) Networking, institutional linkages/positioning Experience in networking. As the contact Person for AFORNET, ANAFE, FAN at various times, Business Manager and later National Secretary, Forestry Association of Nigeria the largest Forestry Association in Africa, I played a key role in

developing a networking strategy that incorporates grassroots ownership and management.
