## Utilization of Wastewaters for Irrigation among Vegetable Producers in Ondo State, Nigeria

The gap between the supply and demand for water is reaching alarming levels and posing a threat to human existence in some parts of the world. In Nigeria problem of insufficient water and lack of good irrigation system has limited most arable crop farmers, especially vegetable farmers to cultivate only during rainy season thereby subjecting most vegetable farmers to diversification. This has contributed to the reasons vegetables take different colours, expensive and sometimes inavailable during dry season. However, some farmers depend on wastewater for irrigation. Thus utilization of wastewater for irrigation among vegetable farmers was investigated. Data collection is ongoing on utilization of wastewaters for irrigation among vegetable farmers in Ondo state.
