Good food consumption pattern in terms of diverse range of food has been shown to increase energy and micronutrients intake and academic performance. Therefore, this study is designed to examine the knowledge of nutrition and food consumption pattern among postgraduate students in the University of Ibadan. Data has been collected while analysis and discussion are on-going.
- (ii) Perception of Nursing Mothers towards Indigenous Complementary Food in Oyo State, Nigeria. Commercial fortified complementary foods are often beyond the reach of the poor especially for Nigerian nursing mothers. The inability to afford these fortified complementary foods or nutritional inadequate composition of local/indigenous food items can lead to malnutrition (Protein-Energy Malnutrition, PEM, or Micronutrient Deficiency) in infants which causes stunted growth and underdevelopment of young children. The project therefore brings to fore, a nexus between good nutrition and effective communication patterns for acceptability of the intervention.
