- (i) Promoting Community-led Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Interventions in Rural Settlements of Nigeria: Lessons from Open Defecation Endemic Communities in Nigeria. Sustainability of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) interventions require a paradigm shift from the supply driven to community-led approach. Achieving this goal requires an understanding of local efforts and challenges faced in solving their WASH related problems. This study addressed these concerns through a case study of affected rural communities in Nigeria. The qualitative data gathering process is on-going. Study will enhance understanding of the environmental and health challenges faced by the rural people due to poor WASH situation. It will also provide feedback on the suitability of the community-led total sanitation intervention for promoting rural hygiene and sanitation.

- (ii) Corruption and Gender Dynamics in Governance for Sustainable Development in Africa. The study is on-going interdisciplinary research involving a group of young faculty members from seven African universities with the funding support from the African Development Bank (AfDB) and Japan Trust Fund (JTF). The field survey has been concluded and data collected are currently being processed for reporting and dissemination of results. Study will provide empirical information on the nature of corruption and gender dynamics in Africa necessary for addressing the problem in order to ensure sustainable development of the continent.
- (iii) Cross-sectoral Characterisation of Public Service Corruption and Designing of Capture Tools in Nigeria. The study intends to employ a multidisciplinary approach utilising analytical dimensions of agriculture, politics, sociology, economy and environment to provide a scientifically generated solution to the problem of corruption through a bottom-up approach to the fight against it. Proposal for the study has been submitted for funding support for field work. The study will enhance understanding of the inner dynamics of corruption in selected local sectors. It will also generate outputs such as policy brief, research articles and tracking tools for benchmarking relative corruption levels across local sectors.
