(a) **Completed**

i. An Assessment of the Capacity of the Community-based Organizations in Kebbi State, Nigeria

Against the backdrop of the new paradigm shift in implementing development projects using bottom up approach of Community Driven Development (CDD), the study assessed the capacity of community based organizations in Kebbi State to implement microprojects for their own development agenda. Findings of the study were given in a technical report as represented by article 49

ii. A Computable General Equilibrium Analysis of Poverty among Socio-economic Groups in Nigeria

The study was designed to understand the general equilibrium effects of liberalization measures with respect to poverty situation of households taking cognizance of the interrelationships between the agents and sectors of the economy. The findings of the study were detailed in a monograph as indicated in article 49.

iii. Profit Disparity among Nigerian Commercial Banks: A Panel Data Analysis

The study examined the causes of profit disparity among Nigerian commercial banks with the aim of understanding why banks on almost equal capital base have differing levels of profit. The outcome of the study was an M Sc. Report and article 28.

iv. Agriculture in Nigeria: Identifying opportunities for increased commercialization and investment

The study provided basis for unlocking constraints to commercialization and investment in the Nigerian agricultural sector for sustained economic growth, enhanced food security, increased competitiveness of products in the domestic, regional, and international markets as well as sustainable environmental management and poverty alleviation. The details of the findings are as documented in article 1.

v. Commodity Opportunity Assessment for Value Addition in the Processing of Rice, Sorghum and Cowpea in Targeted States of Nigeria

The study aimed at providing background for expanding economic opportunities in the agricultural sector by increasing agricultural productivity, enhancing value-added processing and increasing commercialization through private-led and market driven growth and development. The study had as its objectives to identify agro-processing industries involved rice, sorghum and cowpea. Details of the findings are as provided in article 53.

vi. Social Protection Policy Note for Nigeria

This study examined the social protection programmes in Nigeria with a view to evolving better social protection strategies for the country using life cycle approach. The findings are catalogued in a policy note and article 6.

vii. Technical Efficiency of Poultry Egg Production in Ogun State: A Data Envelopment Analysis (DEA) Approach

This study focused on the efficiency of operation of poultry egg farms in Ogun state Nigeria using Data Envelopment Analysis. The main objectives were to know if farmers were operating efficiently and what factors accounted for their efficiency levels. The findings were documented in an M Sc. Project and article 41.

viii. Effects of Social Capital on Rural Poverty in Nigeria

Against the backdrop of increasing focus on the use of local level institutions in addressing poverty and the growing literature on impact of social capital on welfare and poverty the study provided evidence on the effect of social capital on poverty alleviation in Nigeria. The findings of the study were documented in a technical report, articles 35, 43 and 52.

ix. Determinants of Expected Poverty among Rural Households in Nigeria

The non-effectiveness of poverty alleviation programmes worldwide has led to a rethink on the fact that static poverty analysis has not provided adequate guidance towards evolving poverty alleviation policies. This study focused on expected poverty based on examination of vulnerability to poverty of households in Nigeria. The outcome of the research was published in articles 46 and 54.

x. Rapid Assessment of Conditional Cash Transfer Programme in Niger State Nigeria

This study assessed the implementation of conditional cash transfer programme in Nigeria using Niger state as case study with a view to isolating the constraints to effective implementation of the programme. The findings of the research effort are contained in article 55.

(b) In Progress

i. Assessment of Household Targeting for Conditional Cash Transfer in South west Nigeria (Commenced in July, 2009)

The study intends to examine the targeting procedure used for households participating in the Conditional Cash Transfer in Nigeria using south west as a case in point. In specific term, the study is to consider the appropriateness of the targeting mechanism adopted by the CCT programme in the country with a view to isolating the likely error of exclusion and inclusion in the programme. The study is towards a publication as journal article.

ii. Impact of Rural Infrastructure Development under National FADAMA-II on Agricultural Production in Oyo State

Against the backdrop of implementation of Fadama II project that aimed at empowering the poor to sustainably increase their income, this study will examine the impact of rural infrastructure under Fadama II project on agricultural production in Oyo State, Nigeria. The study will assist us in identifying the level of infrastructural development and the impact of the infrastructure on agricultural production.

iii. Determinants of Food Security Transitions among Rural Households in South western Nigeria

This study intends to focus on dynamic and multidimensional nature of food security among rural households in rural Nigeria. The study will isolate the transition in food security across seasons and the key factors affecting movement in and out of food security. This is to lead to journal publications.

iv. Multidimensional Poverty of Shock-exposed Households and Coping Mechanisms in Nigeria

This study aims at determining the socio-economic factors that influence experience of shocks by households with a view to decomposing multidimensional poverty across shocks and coping mechanisms of households in Nigeria. It is expected that the study will itemize the main shocks experienced by rural households and the main households that will be mostly affected by shocks and the extent of multidimensional poverty and the key coping mechanisms of households.

v. Value Chain Analysis and Trade Policy for selected Agricultural Commodities in Nigeria (to commence in October 2010)

The rationale for this proposed study derives from the fact that agricultural chain and trade policy constitutes a key area of opportunity for the Nigerian economy. The outcome of the study will provide a well defined agricultural commodity chain and trade policy direction for the Nigerian agricultural sector. The outcome will also present rural areas of Nigeria with more access to lucrative markets, improved national food security and enhanced opportunity for employment. The result of the policy simulation on commodity chain and agricultural trade issues that is to be undertaken in the study will also assist in identifying the key areas within the agricultural commodity chain and trade to be targeted for future intervention. The study is expected to be completed in 2013.
